Purpose of Grant

Brandywine Valley Hemophilia offers these funds for three essential purposes:

- To enable eligible organizations or individuals to build capacity to achieve their mission statements
- To offer financial resources to continue promising research or provide consumer services in ways impactful to the Bleeding Disorder Community.
- To facilitate continued training and education helpful to those providing services to the Bleeding Disorder community

<u>Eligibility</u>

Applications are currently accepted from the following Tax-Exempt organizations or individuals attached to these organizations:

- Local institutions in our service area supporting people with heritable bleeding disorders and their families.
- Treatment Centers within our service area supporting the Bleeding Disorder Community and their Families.
- Individual physicians or researchers investigating bleeding disorders and/or the ways it impacts individuals and their families. These individuals must be recognized members of organizations holding a tax=exempt status.

Criteria for Consideration

To be considered for funding, the following criteria must be met.

- The individual or organization operates under the IRS tax-exemptions 501(c))(3) or 170(c)(1) and evidence of this status must be provided
- An application, with supporting required attachments, must be **submitted by November 3, 2023** to be considered for 2023 funding.
- The project/service/training will be begun, and progress shown through progress reports submitted during the grant year, 2023-2024

Grant Ceiling for 2023

The ceiling for the maximum grant awarded 2023 is \$5,000.

Grant Scoring

The BVH Grant Committee scores requests based on the following criteria:

- How well the applicant describes the project/research in ways showing benefits for the bleeding disorder community.
- The organization/individual's mission and number of patients served
- A need for funding and shows how the funds will be distributed
- Explains how SMART objectives will be met
- Presents a clear and complete budget showing how funds will be used

Objectives

Please write all objectives for the proposed project using SMART format

- Be *specific*,
- Show *measurable* outcomes
- Show *attainable* outcomes
- Explain how the grant will be used in a *timely* fashion throughout 2023

<u>Budget</u>

Expenses must be itemized and justified, along with a calculation of how the item totals were derived.

Project Collaborations

Collaborations are encouraged. The organization/individual submitting the grant becomes the fiscal agent for the project and provides the evidence and justification for the distribution of funds.

An email confirmation to the primary contact provided on the application will provide evidence of the application being received.

Awarding of the grant will be finalized by December 1, 2023

Progress/final report

6-month report is due showing the progress to date. If the project is completed within the six-month period, this may be omitted, and final report submitted. A final report is due **December 30, 2023** showing objectives met. No further funding requests will be considered without this documentation.

Authorized Signature

Applications and letters of collaboration must be signed by the organization's authorized official. This individual will be the point person for all questions regarding the project/research and accountable for the authorization of all funds.
