AI Dupont Children's Hospital & Christiana Care Health Systems joint HTC

In 2018, Christiana Care Health System and Nemours duPont Hospital for children began the process of applying for Hemophilia Treatment Center (HTC) status through the Region III Federally Funded Hemophilia Treatment Centers. The two health centers submitted a combined application since Nemours has the availability to provide care to pediatric patients up to age 21 and Christiana Care primarily had been caring for adults.

Our joint application was approved, and we had a site visit from the Region III leadership to both locations in December of 2018. We were notified in January of 2019 that we were approved for HTC status and could not have been happier. We are now officially known as the *Delaware Hemophilia Treatment Center*.

This partnership makes us the first of its kind in the Nation! Nowhere else are there two different health systems partnering to provide comprehensive treatment to people with bleeding disorders and we are very proud of that fact. Through this partnership, we will be able to provide care across the lifespan and make transition from pediatric care to adult care seamless. Our teams are working together to establish shared treatment plans as well as transition plans so that our patients are cared for in the best way possible regardless of age or location. Both locations have a dedicated hematologist as well as on call hematologists, nurse coordinators, social workers and physical therapists. We meet as a team quarterly to discuss protocols as well as patients who will be transitioning and records are shared so that the patient does not have to worry about taking care of that process.

We look forward to serving the bleeding disorder community for years to come!



Research Spotlight: CHOP Hemophilia A Gene Therapy

CHOP (Children's Hospital of Philadelphia) Hemophilia and Bleeding Disorders Program was established in 1973 to provide families with a comprehensive, family-centered approach to care. CHOP not only treats bleeding disorder patients but is actively involved in research to improve the care of patients.

Gene therapy for Hemophilia A holds the promise of providing lifelong protection from bleeding after a single administration of the medicine. Recent clinical trial success for gene therapy for hemophilia B has demonstrated the potential of gene therapy for inherited bleeding disorders. However, hemophilia B gene therapy has dramatically benefited from the use of a naturally occurring factor IX variant (factor IX Padua), which dramatically enhances the potency of the gene therapy product. There is currently no analogous factor VIII variant to factor IX Padua that could similarly supercharge hemophilia A gene therapy. The goal of CHOP's research project is to make such a factor VIII variant.
